Reading Luke 2: 21 –40

When eight days were completed for his circumcision, He was named Jesus, the name given Him by the angel before He was conceived in the womb.

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, they took Him up to Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord," and to offer the sacrifice of "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons," in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord.

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Messiah of the Lord.

He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the Child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to Him, he took Him into his arms and blessed God, saying: *"Now, Master, You may let Your servant go in peace, according to Your word, for my eyes have seen Your salvation, which You prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for Your people Israel."*

The Child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about Him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary His mother, "Behold, this Child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted (and you yourself a sword will pierce) so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed."

There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never

left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the Child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem. When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The Child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon Him.

Reading Matthew 27: 35 – 54

After they had crucified Him, they divided His garments by casting lots; then they sat down and kept watch over Him there.

And they placed over His head the written charge against Him: This is Jesus, the King of the Jews.

Two revolutionaries were crucified with Him, one on His right and the other on His left.

Those passing by reviled Him, shaking their heads and saying, "You Who would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days, save Yourself, if You are the Son of God, (and) come down from the cross!"

Likewise the chief priests with the scribes and elders mocked Him and said, "He saved others; He cannot save Himself. So He is the King of Israel! Let Him come down from the cross now, and we will believe in Him. He trusted in God; let Him deliver Him now if He wants Him. For He said, 'I am the Son of God.'"

From noon onward, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. And about three o'clock Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "My God, my God, why have You forsaken Me?"

Some of the bystanders who heard it said, "This One is calling for Elijah.

"Immediately one of them ran to get a sponge; he soaked it in wine, and putting it on a reed, gave it to Him to drink. But the rest said, "Wait, let us see if Elijah comes to save Him."

But Jesus cried out again in a loud voice, and gave up His spirit.

And behold, the veil of the sanctuary was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth quaked, rocks were split, tombs were opened, and the bodies of many saints who had fallen asleep were raised.

The centurion and the men with him who were keeping watch over Jesus feared greatly when they saw the earthquake and all that was happening, and they said, "*Truly, this was the Son of God!*"

Thoughts of De La Salle Meditations

Although Jesus Christ died for all, the benefit of His death is, nevertheless, not effected in everyone, because all do not make the effort to apply it to themselves. The response of our will on our part is necessary in order to make it effective. It is up to each of us to achieve and complete the work of our redemption.

The Spirit of the Living God acts in us and by us through the power of Jesus Christ.

God gives us so many signs of His goodness toward us. Jesus Christ Himself says that He came into the world to give us life and to give it to us in abundance.
