The Inspiration for our modern day Santa Claus and Father Christmas


He touched the hearts of the people and inspired them with the true meaning of giving as he led them to Christ.

According to tradition, Nicholas was born in Asia Minor and even in his youth was known for his zeal in helping the unfortunate and oppressed. In his native city of Patara, there was a poor man who had three marriageable daughters, but could find no husbands for them because he could offer no suitable dowry. The contemptible idea struck him to sacrifice the innocence of his daughters to gain the needed money. When Nicholas became aware of this, he went by night and threw a bag containing as much gold as was needed for a dowry through the window. This he repeated the second and third nights.

Another tradition surrounding Nicholas tells of him calming the sea by his prayers during a ship voyage.

Nicholas was imprisoned for the faith and was Bishop of Myra. It is known that he took part in the Council of Nicea.

He had a peaceful death, uttering the words; "Into Your hands, I commend my spirit." He died in Myra and much later his remains were transferred to Bari, Italy.

Saint Nicholas is highly venerated in the East as a miracle worker, as preacher of the Word of God, and spokesman of the Father.

REFLECTION Saint Basil – Fourth Century

What keeps you from giving now? Aren't your own warehouses full? Isn't the reward promised? The command is clear: the hungry person is dying now, the naked person is freezing now, the person in debt is beaten now – and you want to wait until tomorrow? "I am not doing any harm," you say. "I just want to keep what I own, that's all." You own! If everyone took only what they needed and gave the rest to those in need, there would be no such thing as rich and poor. After all, didn't you come into life naked, and won't you return naked to the earth?

The cost banging unused in your closet belongs to the person;

The bread in your cupboard belongs to the hungry person;
The coat hanging unused in your closet belongs to the person
who needs it; the shoes in your closet belong to the person with
no shoes; the money you put into the bank belongs to the poor.
You do wrong to everyone you could help but fail to help.

Saint Ambrose – Fourth Century

The large rooms of which you are so proud are in fact your shame. They are big enough to hold crowds – and also big enough to shut out the voice of the poor...there is your sister or brother, naked, crying! And you stand confused over the choice of an attractive floor covering.
