PRAYING SATURDAY of the SACRED TRIDUUM Holy Saturday - The Vigil of Easter

REFLECTION:

We pray in His name for the great gift of the liberty of the daughters and sons of God. Christ is the Redeemer not only of souls and of separate individuals; He is the Redeemer of the whole person and of the whole world. He wants to restore our wholeness and liberty...

We can pray and act in the name of Christ the Redeemer when we are truly freeing ourselves and are working not only for an individualized freedom but for freedom for all, especially those most oppressed, most discriminated against and outcast.
