




Below are some testimonials from fellow hockey friends he played with in the past:

A couple of examples are the clinics at the Saddle and Cycle Club in Chicago and Willow brook Ice Arena with Dennis Hull. Your time teaching and supporting Hockey is a testament of your love of the sport. I should also mention that I had the privilege of working with and for you at the Twin Ice Forum in Oak Brook Terrace. It was a pleasure and some of the best fun in my life playing right with you and on at least a dozen hockey teams from Junior through Senior league

in and around the Chicago area. I couldn't think of a greater way of expressing the thanks you well deserve for your participation and support for the sport of hockey than induction to the Illinois Hockey Hall of Fame.
